

Breeding Committee Report for 2010

Evaluations

Creekside Farm (judges: Johannes Hoyos AT, Svanhildur Hall IS)

6 horses were fully evaluated
2 horses were conformation only

Mill Farm (judges: Barbara Frische US, Sigbjörn Björnsson IS)

8 horses were fully evaluated
7 horses were conformation only

Winterhorse Park (judges: Barbara Frische US, Johannes Hoyos AT)

17 horses were fully evaluated
11 horses were conformation only

All three evaluations had no special remarks by the judges.

A new microchip reader was purchased and tried. It worked well on all chips and is now part of the equipment case of the Congress.

Young horse evaluations

Barbara Frische could not perform all young horse evaluations, which were planned for 2010. Hopefully she'll be resuming her work throughout the country in 2011.

Young horses were evaluated at Creekside Farm, Winterhorse Park and several private breeding farms.

The acceptance of the linear assessment form is great and it has proven itself as a great learning tool for breeders, handlers and interested spectators.

Committee Work

The committee finalized the breeding handbooks for organizers and riders/handlers. The latest version will be published online soon.

Anne Elwell award

The 2010 award goes to Dan Slott as the breeder of Hamur from Mill Farm. Hamur was shown in the Mill Farm Breeding Evaluation in 2010 and scored 8.16 for conformation and 7.79 for rideability. With an overall score of 7.94, he is the highest evaluated domestic bred horse in the US.
